Our Coast Guardians Program provides high school students with the knowledge and opportunities to become stewards of our unique coastline.

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Coast Guardians is a flagship environmental education program tailored towards highschool students. As Coast Guardians, schools participate in multiple field sessions on the coast, taking ownership of a site to help enhance their understanding of the natural environment.

Integrating theory-based learning with a range of hands-on conservation opportunities, students are engaged in real-world social, environmental, and cultural issues impacting our coast. In addition, the program fosters development of relationship building between the students, the environment, and the wider community.

Recipients of the 2018 Victorian Coastal Council Award for Education, our programs are run by highly skilled education professionals with years of experience and knowledge of our coast.

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SESSION DETAILS

We understand that each school, student and educational facility has different needs and wants. For this reason, we offer programs that are flexible and can cater to student's abilities and environmental understanding needs.

- **Number of sessions:** Whether you are looking for one-off sessions for multiple classes in a year level, or a series of sessions for a specialist class, our Education team will work with you to design the best program for your students' needs.
- **Session time and length:** Sessions typically run between 1 to 2.5 hours dependent on the activity and groups needs.
- **Session location:** Managing the coastline from Point Impossible to Lorne and beyond, our 'coastal classrooms' provide a range of engaging, fun, authentic learning opportunities for students of all ages. Our team will work with you to choose the most suitable location for your needs.
- **Group sizes:** We work to a 1 Educator :30 student ratio. Groups beyond 30 students can be accommodated and will include an additional Educator Fee.
