FAQ

We understand that each school, student and educational facility has different needs and wants. For this reason, we offer programs that are flexible and can cater to student's abilities and environmental understanding needs. We consider:

- **Session type:** Whether you are looking for a once-off session, excursion to multiple week, whole term, or year long program, our Education team will work with you to design the best program for your students' needs.
- **Session time and length:** Sessions typically run between 1 to 2.5 hours dependent on the activity and your group's needs.
- **Session location:** Managing the coastline from Point Impossible to Marengo our 'coastal classrooms' provide a range of engaging, fun and authentic learning opportunities for students of all ages.
- **Group sizes:** We work to a 1 Educator : 25 students ratio (1:30 for secondary classes). For larger groups additional Educators will be allocated (see below).

1. School incursions delivered within 40km of Anglesea. Schools beyond this range may accrue additional travel fees.
2. School groups staying at selected Great Ocean Road Authority caravan parks or campgrounds qualify for one free Environmental Education session per class.
3. Kinder sessions available within 30km of Anglesea to local kinder/preschool providers.
4. Additional educator fee applies to groups over the 1:25 ratio and every groups of 25 thereafter.
