

GENERAL USE Terms & Conditions – To be read in conjunction with the Port Management (Local Port) Regulations 2025.

Recreational fishers can fish from the shore from a range of locations within the Port including the Main Breakwater, Lee Breakwater and the Fishermen's Berth (when cargo operations are not occurring).

When fishing in the Port fishers must be aware of vessels moving in their vicinity and retract their lines when a vessel is approaching to avoid fouling the vessel propeller.

Fishing is permitted in designated areas of the Port, including the Main Breakwater, Lee Breakwater, and Fishermen's Berth, provided that no commercial or cargo operations are underway.

All persons fishing within the Port must retract lines and secure fishing gear when vessels are approaching, to prevent interference with navigation or port operations.

Do not disturb wildlife (seals, birds, etc.) within the port precinct

A person must not clean fish on the wharf or other structure in the Port.

A person must not organise or conduct, or take part in organising or conducting, an organised activity in a local port except unless in accordance with a local port permit.

Any form of water based pollution is to be reported immediately to Port Officers, whether by the instigator or an observer, and every effort made to minimise spread and contamination.

A person must not damage, deface or interfere with any property or infrastructure in a local port which is owned, managed or otherwise provided by the port manager except in accordance with a local port permit.

A person must not climb on or over, or otherwise enter onto, any vessel in a local port which is owned by another person unless the first mentioned person has permission of the vessel's master or owner; or has the permission of another person authorised by, or acting on behalf of, the owner.

A person must not leave or deposit any litter or industrial waste in a local port except in a receptacle provided for that purpose

Bicycles, skateboards, scooters etc shall not be ridden on any marina walkway and must be stored onboard vessels where possible.

Noise shall be kept to a minimum at all times. Owners should use discretion operating radios or musical apparatus so as not to cause undue disturbance to others.

Swimming, snorkelling and diving within the Port is permitted in the designated set-asides within the Port. A dive flag must be always displayed. Strictly no spear fishing permitted.

Dogs must be kept on leashes on the Port wharves and marina at all times. Owners must clean up any dog droppings immediately.

Children must be always supervised near water, and running on piers or jetties is prohibited.

Emergency life rings and ladders are provided for safety and are located at regular intervals along the Fishermen's Landing and Lee Breakwater. Visitors must not tamper with, remove, or obstruct access to these safety aids.

A person must not jump or dive from a wharf, a natural asset or any other infrastructure in a local port in contravention of a sign or notice erected or displayed on or near that wharf, natural asset or other infrastructure by the port manager except in accordance with a local port permit.

No camping allowed
